

NAME

`comm` – print lines common to two files

SYNOPSIS

comm [- [**123**]] file1 file2

DESCRIPTION

Comm reads *file1* and *file2*, which should be in sort, and produces a three column output: lines only in *file1*; lines only in *file2*; and lines in both files.

The output is written on the standard output.

Flags 1, 2, or 3 suppress printing of the corresponding column. Thus **comm -12** prints only the lines common to the two files; **comm -23** prints only lines in the first file but not in the second; **comm -123** is a no-op.
